

# Judy Brown

Judy Brown is a multi-talented performer whose acting on-camera, spokesperson and singing abilities have earned her featured roles on stage, in television and motion pictures.

She attended the Cleveland Institute of Music majoring in vocal studies and went on to perform with Johnny Singer's Orchestra at numerous fundraising events, including appearances for Presidents Gerald Ford, Jimmy Carter, Ronald Reagan and England's Princess Margaret with drummer Eric Singer who performs with the group KISS.

Judy has sung the National Anthem at nationally televised games for her hometown Cleveland Indians, Browns and Cavaliers as well as the Los Angeles, Lakers, Dodgers, Kings and Angels when she lived there.

Her "jingle" singing has been heard on radio and TV commercials played across the United States and Canada. She was the solo voice for all three Sea World Adventure Parks for four years.

As an in demand commercial talent, she has been seen as an actor and heard doing voice-over work in television and radio work in local and national commercial markets.

She has played the lead role in Equity musicals ranging from Sound of Music to Candide, South Pacific to Grease and toured in How to Succeed in Business Without Really Trying with Academy Award winner Don Ameche (her LA mentor) and Oliver with comedian Rip Taylor.

Judy has had recurring roles on the NBC daytime dramas Santa Barbara and Days of Our Lives as well as a featured role on the short-lived CBS/Lorimar series Bridges to Cross starring Suzanne Pleshette, Roddy McDowall and Eva Gabor.

Judy studied at **The Groundlings Theatre** with Kathy Griffin during the theatre's heyday, doing improv on Melrose Ave. in Los Angeles with Will Farrell, Lisa Kudrow, Jon Lovitz, and Mindy Sterling.

Her motion picture credits include Zoetrope Studio's The Escape Artist starring Raul Julia, Cannon Film productions of Surrender with Michael Caine and Sally Field, Dutch Treat and A Christmas Story starring Darrin McGavin.

As a runner up to a former Miss America it isn't surprising that Judy was chosen to be a TV model and spokesperson for Frederick's of Hollywood for three years. Appearing on national talk shows such as Oprah, Phil Donahue and Sally Jessy Raphael and dozens of locally produced morning and afternoon shows on television stations across America.

After hosting the syndicated entertainment magazine show What's Hot, What's Not, Judy began appearing on KCET/Los Angeles, the public TV station serving Southern and Central California, as one of their principal spokespeople for over ten years.

Moving to Cleveland in 2001 Judy produced, hosted and directed her highly acclaimed TV Series Only Ohio that aired on all 12 Ohio PBS stations.

She also worked for WVIZ as an on-camera spokesperson for two years.

She just completed being the Northeast Ohio Spokerperson for **50 Floor** an national flooring franchise for five years appearing a few times a week on Fox-8's New Day Cleveland and WKYC-3's Good Company.

Judy is also a proud mother of her son Ben and daughter Mary-Kate who recently made her a grandmother.
